REASONS FOR SENTENCING

[1] BURGESS J.P.T.C. (Oral): In regards to the waste of meat, you are fined \$750 for that. For making false statements, it will be another \$500.

[14] CLAYTON THOMAS: Not really.

[15] THE COURT: Okay. So you can look after matters today at the court registry?

[16] CLAYTON THOMAS: Yes.
